

- Align local goals and budgets to improve student outcomes.
- Intended to be simple, transparent and easily understood by educators, parents, and the public.
- Emphasize **state priorities** moving forward.

# 8 State Priorities for the LCAP

LCAP Priorities	Accountability Measurement
1) Basic Services	<ul> <li>Rate of teacher mis-assignment</li> <li>Student access to standards-aligned materials</li> <li>Facilities in good repair</li> </ul>
2) Common Core	<ul> <li>Implementation of Common Core for all students including English Language learners</li> </ul>
3) Parental Involvement	<ul><li>Seek parental input</li><li>Efforts to improve parent participation</li></ul>
4) Student Achievement	<ul> <li>Performance on assessments</li> <li>Academic Performance Index</li> <li>Students college and career ready, CTE completion, UC a-g, etc.</li> <li>English learners becoming reclassified and English proficient</li> <li>Students passing AP exam with 3 or higher</li> <li>Students determined prepared for college by Early Assessment Program (EAP)</li> </ul>

# 8 State Priorities for the LCAP (Cont.)

LCAP Priorities	Accountability Measurement
5) Student Engagement	<ul> <li>School attendance rates</li> <li>Chronic absenteeism rates</li> <li>Middle/high school dropout rates</li> <li>High school graduation rates</li> </ul>
6) School Climate	<ul><li>Student suspension rates</li><li>Student expulsion rates</li><li>Other local measures</li></ul>
7) Broad Course of Study/Access	<ul> <li>Student access and enrollment in all required areas of study</li> </ul>
8) Other Student Outcomes	<ul> <li>Other indicators of student performance in required areas of study</li> <li>May include performance on other exams</li> </ul>

The LCAP divides the 8 state priorities into 3 categories or "buckets".




- Basic Correct teacher assignments and student access to instructional materials
