JOB DESCRIPTION:

Provides an enrichment activities-based program for transitional kindergarten students in a manner that nurtures and guides them, with great consideration for the needs of each individual child and the class as a whole. Offers developmentally appropriate curriculum that is aligned with kindergarten standards, English language development standards and world language content standards, but modified to meet the academic, social and emotional needs of younger children. Uses a variety of instructional strategies, best practices, resources and technologies to meet students' diverse learning needs.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Hold valid Multiple Subject credential from the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing with BCLAD (Spanish)
- 2. Authorization to teach both integrated and designated English learner development (ELD)
- 3. Bachelor's or higher degree
- 4. As per SB 876, 24 units in ECE or a child development teacher permit issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing or equivalent

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- 1. Instruct students in Transitional Kindergarten, using district curriculum in both English and Spanish, and including more opportunities for social-emotional, language development and communication through dramatic play; small group instruction; and intentional teaching through hands-on activities.
- 2. Exhibit experience and knowledge with component areas for the TK program: Social-Emotional Development, Physical-Motor Development, Cognitive Development, Oral Language and Literacy Development, Self-Regulation, and English Language Development (ELD) designated and integrated strategies.
- 3. Demonstrate evidence of creating instructional plans for transitional kindergarten and analyze/adjust instruction based on formative data and student needs.
- 4. Willingness to support English language learners, foster youth, and socioeconomically disadvantaged students. Consistently demonstrates a positive attitude and communication techniques when working with students, staff, and parents.
- 5. Willingness to support the school in various aspects such as attending outside school hour functions and participate on school committees. Attend staff meetings, PLC/collaboration meetings, scheduled in-service days, assigned committee meetings, student success teams, IEP meetings and other events.
- 6. Teaches elementary content in two languages and integrates the teaching of content area. Use best practices for language development strategies and ensure students' development in both languages.

- 7. Has fluency in target languages required (both written and spoken)
- 8. Is familiar with language immersion models and curriculum. Participate in developing and building the dual immersion program.
- Provide a level of instruction based on each student's achievement potential, by drawing on and valuing individual backgrounds, interests, temperaments, development of social skills, through thorough activity preparation and positive classroom management.
- 10. Establish and Articulate goals for student learning though the designing and implementing of both short and long-term classroom projects.
- 11. Assess students' progress in order to guide instruction.
- 12. Participate in teacher enrichment activities and staff development focused on agreed-upon areas of program development when school funds allow.
- 13. Hold parent/teacher conferences and communicate with parents through weekly notes, phone calls, email, etc.
- 14. Be an active part of the dual immersion implementation and promotion committee, including making presentations at district and various site events.
- 15. Accept other duties as assigned.
