PARA-PROFESSIONAL AIDE TO ELEMENTARY PHYSICAL EDUCATION

JOB DESCRIPTION:

Under the direction of a supervisor, issues and maintains athletic and physical education equipment; assist in monitoring student activities in an assigned athletic facility; maintain inventory and other routine records.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Education:

- High School Diploma or Equivalent.
- Associates of Arts Degree or 48 college units or NCLB certification.

Experience:

Successful experience working with students in a physical education setting.
Ability:

- Assist in monitoring student activities in an assigned athletic facility.
- Communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
- Establish and maintain cooperative and effective working relationships with others.
- Understand, be sensitive to and respect the diverse academic, socioeconomic, ethnic, religious, and cultural backgrounds, disabilities and sexual orientation of students, faculty, and staff.
- Issue and maintain athletic and physical education equipment.
- Learn, apply and explain applicable district policies, rules and regulations.
- Maintain inventory and other routine records.
- Maintain consistent, punctual and regular attendance.

Knowledge:

- Health and safety regulations.
- Materials and equipment used in team and individual sports.
- Proper methods of fitting various athletic uniforms and equipment to provide adequate protection.

TYPICAL DUTIES:

- Assist teachers and coaches in the physical set up for PE classes and athletic events.
- 2. Control student activities and behaviors as necessary and according to established guidelines and procedures to assure health and safety of students.
- 3. Fit uniforms and equipment properly to assure adequate protection for athletes.
- 4. Issue uniforms, equipment and supplies for use.
- 5. Maintain athletic and physical education equipment, supplies and uniforms in good repair and in a sanitary condition.

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- 6. Lift and carry equipment.
- 7. Perform other related duties as assigned.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Employees in this position must have the ability to:

- Work outside exposed to the weather
- Work in temperatures between 35 44 degrees
- Work in temperatures between 100 104 degrees
- Work on surfaces that are slippery and wet
- Work on surfaces that are uneven or on an incline
- Exposed to direct sunlight
- Exposed to insect/spider bites and stings
- Tasks performed involve leaning, bending forward, kneeling or squatting
- Tasks performed with hands above the shoulders
- Tasks performed with hands behind or to the sides of the body
- Be able to assist injured students
